

USER MANUAL FOR FCCU MOODLE MOBILE APPLICATION

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Introduction

The Moodle Mobile Application allows users to access courses and learning materials on the go. This manual provides a guide for logging in and an overview of the features available in the free version.

Process of Connecting Moodle Mobile Application with FCCU LMS

To log in to the FCCU Moodle site Mobile Application, follow these steps:

Download the App:

- 1. Go to the App Store (iOS) or Google Play Store (Android).
- 2. Search for "Moodle" and download the Moodle Mobile Application.

Open the App:

- 3. Tap on the Moodle icon to launch the application once it is downloaded and installed onto your mobile.
- 4. Select your role.
 - a. For Students "I'm a learner".
 - b. For Instructor "I'm an educator".

Enter Site URL:

5. After selection of the role, the app will redirect you to "Connect to Moodle" screen. Add a below link under "Your site" field.



6. After adding the link, the options will populate below on the screen (as shown in screenshot). Now tap on "Connect to your site".

- 7. Enter your username and password.
- 8. Tap "Log in" button to access your courses and dashboard.

Features in the Moodle Mobile Application:

The Moodle Mobile Application provides several features for free, allowing users to access essential functionalities:

1. Access to Course Content:

a. View and download course materials, including documents and videos.

2. Communication Tools:

- a. Send and receive messages from other users.
- b. Participate in course forums for discussion.

3. Activity Completion Tracking:

a. View activities, quizzes, and assignments along with the submission attempts.

4. Assignment Submission:

a. Submit assignments with file uploads or online text.

5. Quiz Attempt:

a. Take quizzes directly through the app.

6. Offline Access:

a. Download course materials for offline access.

7. Calendar

a. View upcoming deadlines and events in the app calendar.

8. Assignment Grading:

a. Teachers can view assignment submissions, grade students and provide feedback.

Limitations in the Moodle Mobile Application:

Here are some features will not be supported with the Moodle Application.

Note: We recommend to use the Moodle Web Application to avoid limitations.

Role: Teacher

1. No Edit Mode:

a. Teachers cannot enable editing mode to add, modify, or delete course resources and activities within the Mobile app. All course management actions must be done via the web version.

2. Limited Resource and Activity Uploads:

a. Teachers are unable to upload or create new resources (like files, pages, or URLs) directly in the app.

3. Basic Forum:

a. Teachers can participate in forums but cannot delete the post or lock the discussion.

4. Limited Attendance Management:

a. While teachers can mark attendance, they cannot set up new sessions or modify existing ones through the app.

5. Gradebook Access Only:

a. Teachers can view the gradebook but cannot edit grades or configure grade items directly in the app.

Role: Student

1. Limited Offline Access:

a. Only certain materials (like PDFs or files) are available offline. Interactive activities like quizzes, forums, and some assignments need an internet connection to access.

2. Reduced Feedback Visibility:

a. Students might have limited visibility of assignment feedback, especially if the feedback involves file attachments, multimedia, or detailed comments.

3. Reduced Storage for Offline Content:

a. Limited storage capacity for downloaded resources can impact offline study sessions, especially if there are multiple large files or videos.

4. Restricted Push Notifications:

a. The app does not provide push notifications.
